


YOUR NAME

1 FONT

3 LADY CHAPEL


a. Who is the 'Lady' shown in the **East window**?

a. What is odd about this eagle?



9 SOUTH WALL


Cross the church and find the third window to the right of the pulpit (go towards the back of the church). a. What is the story being told here?
